# **2015 FF Midwest Leadership Conference**



The 2015 Midwest Conference was hosted by the Cedar Rapids/ Iowa City Friendship Force. With a few exceptions, the Midwest clubs each sent three delegates to the conference in Cedar Rapids. Attending the conference for FFGM were Rosie Haas, Sara, Dale Harmelink, and Dave Kalan. The conference was introduced and guided by Dale Moore, president of the Cedar Rapids/Iowa City Club, and the primary speakers were Adrienne Moen, Midwest Regional President, Matthew Nidik, FFI Department of Program Services, and Dave Kalan, FFGM Member and FFI Board Member.

The discussions included FFI news/events and the 2015 New Strategic Plan Overview, new partnership opportunities and an introduction to the latest NEXTGEN tech-

niques. We also had breakout sessions to discuss how our clubs could produce great leaders as we attract younger members and address the NEXTGEN concepts. Perhaps the most interesting portion of the conference for me was the second day as 4 delegates each addressed individual prepared topics of about a half hour. The host club in Solothurn provided us with a variety of cultural and fun activities and with plenty of Swiss Gemütlichkeit.

- Walking tour of Zürich and welcome dinner
- Tour of Lucerne and trip via cogwheel train to top of Mt. Rigi
- Tour of studio of Swiss painter Albert Anker
- Walking tour of Solothurn during a festival weekend
- Woodland nature walk to an interesting shrine
- Tour of Bern and visit to a school where we interacted with pharmacy aide students
- Visit to a museum where we saw clocks with twittering birds & clocks with odd actions
- Farewell dinner where the host club sang (with great animation) & where a club member played the alphorn for us







All of our ambassadors raved about their hosts, who were attentive to our every need. Many friendships were formed. Two new members to our club who were on their first exchange loved the entire experience.



After the exchange week, 14 of us continued on to an extension with two nights in the following towns: Mürren, Zermatt, and St. Moritz.

#### Summary:

- Mürren: high on a mountain side, accessible only by cable car/gondola. No cars are allowed. Surrounded by the fabulous Alps. Visitors can go even higher via gondola to the Shilthorn, a mountain peak where a James Bond scene was filmed.
- Zermatt, where we just had to look up to see the Matterhorn. A brief snowstorm in the village had us all walking with baby steps.
- We got to our final destination, St. Moritz, via the Glacier Express, a train with extended windows that allowed us to drink in the sheer beauty of the countryside. The 8-hr. train ride took us through many tunnels and over many bridges. At one



hotel, we were treated to an unplanned concert. A woman entertained two Chinese women by playing a bandoneon (accordion) and singing Swiss folk songs with friends.

The exchange and extension were unforgettable.
